

Jupiter in Aquarius

The sign that Jupiter occupies shows the language you speak to grow and to experience faith. The element of the sign is the dominant language and gives specific guidance about how and why you grow and how and why you build faith. The sign itself is a dialect of that language and provides additional, more specific information about how you grow, expand your consciousness, and experience faith.

JOURNAL QUESTIONS & INSTRUCTIONS

Read the descriptions below, and then go back and revisit each of the earlier journal questions. Review your answers, and then expand on them, incorporating the new information about the language you speak. Focus on how and why you express Jupiter.

Jupiter in Air Signs

With Jupiter in an Air sign, you grow and expand on the mental and intellectual plane. Growth is conscious, impersonal, objective, and external, and always begins as a thought form. You seek out ideas and abstract concepts, and you engage with them objectively and impersonally. You are most interested in exploring all that exists in your current reality and your current level of consciousness.

You have faith in facts and data, and things that can be verified objectively. Your faith only extends to the surface, and that which is known and can be viewed in the light. You have an inherent distrust of things that are hidden or that operate beneath the surface. Most notably, you lack faith in feelings and emotions. Because they are internal and subjective, feelings are inherently suspect. Faith is objective, sequential, conscious and abstract. It requires some kind of logical, reasonable foundation.

Jupiter in Aquarius

Jupiter in Aquarius approaches experiences with an open mind, knowing that each new experience expands the context of your “little r” reality, which results in greater freedom for everyone. Humanity is the context for Jupiter in Aquarius; when any individual’s consciousness



expands, it benefits everyone. Jupiter in Aquarius has absolute faith that aligning with spiritual truth supports all of humanity. He expands by identifying with groups, society, and humanity, knowing his connection to something significantly larger than the “little s” self. The biggest challenge for Jupiter in Aquarius is to stay out of “Other People’s Business,” and “God’s Business,” and avoid the traps of anger and pride. It’s easy to become lost in the abstract and theoretical, picturing a utopian world for humanity that fails to address the value of individual humans.

When you are in Right Relationship with Jupiter in Aquarius, everything in your “little r” reality enhances the freedom to express your “Big S” Self. The rules, boundaries and structures of society support you, helping you to stay in integrity, so that you can distinguish between what is real and what is true. You have absolute faith that the truth will set you free. You appreciate the symbiotic relationship you have as an individual with the rest of humanity. You are aware that in exchange for the support of society, you have an obligation to make the world a better place for everyone. You do this, however, without ever leaving the confines of “My Business.” You know that a problem cannot be solved at the level of consciousness that created it. All of the things that appear to be problems in society are manifestations of the lower levels of consciousness. In every case, the solution requires power, not force. You know that the most significant contribution you can make to alleviate the suffering in the world is to choose the best-feeling thought currently available to you. When your consciousness expands, it raises the consciousness of all of humanity. You may also be inspired to take action in form, supporting various causes and social organizations. Your real contribution, however, is your consciousness.

When you are out of alignment with Jupiter in Aquarius, you experience a tremendous lack of self-worth, and a profound need for approval. Since you do not have a connection to your “Big S” Self, the core insecurities of your “little s” self are magnified and augmented. You become addicted to seeking approval and acceptance from others. You collect memberships in groups, clubs, and social organizations, and chameleon-like, you adopt the persona of the ideal, quintessential member of the group. You actively avoid spending any time alone, because without the approval, acceptance, and validation of others, there is nothing to shield you from the growing sense of shame, self-loathing and isolation. Unable to stand this pain, you deflect it by moving into “Other People’s Business,” and projecting your suffering on your “little r” reality. If you don’t feel accepted and loved by society, then something must be wrong with society. Everywhere you look, you see massive injustice and repression. Fueled by righteous anger, you rebel. The more you personally suffer, the greater the evil you perceive. Any limit or restriction becomes intolerable and unacceptable. You believe that you fight for freedom, but in fact, you pursue anarchy. You’re not interested in a world that works for everyone; you’re interested in a world that works for you.
